# 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

The Jersey 360 Jamboree was a huge success with over 4,000 Scouts, Scouters, and families in attendance for a fall weekend of exciting programs, shows, and exhibits.



Cub Scouts earned 2,510 ranks, and Scouts BSA members earned 2,449 ranks and 10,422 merit badges.

353 Scouts and Scouters participated in high adventure activities including Philmont Scout Ranch and Florida Sea Base.

Over 3,600 Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA members, and families participated in PPC Adventure Programs.

7,849 youth and adults participated in Klondike Derbies, Cub Scout and Scouts BSA Camporees and other district events.

318 young men and women earned the rank of Eagle Scout.

1,701 youth attended a summer camp experience at our council camps that include Camp Somers and Camp Wheeler at Mount Allamuchy Scout Reservation, Winnebago Scout Reservation, and Cub Scout Day Camp at Watchung Reservation.

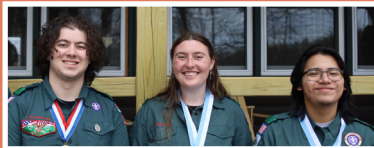

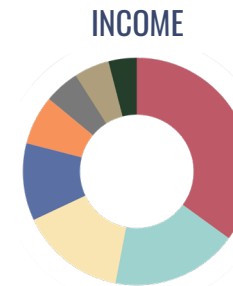

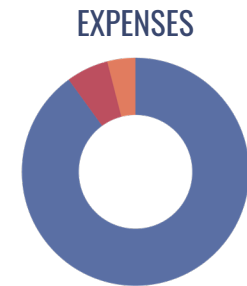
